

COVID-19 Quarantine Requirements for Travelers

On March 3, 2021, Governor Cuomo announced that domestic travelers are no longer required to quarantine or test-out within 90 days of full vaccination. This applies to asymptomatic individuals. *Anyone exhibiting symptoms of illness following travel should immediately seek COVID-19 testing and self-isolate pending test results*.

Fully vaccinated travelers **<u>should NOT</u>** complete the Traveler Health Form.

International travelers must continue to follow CDC quarantine guidance.

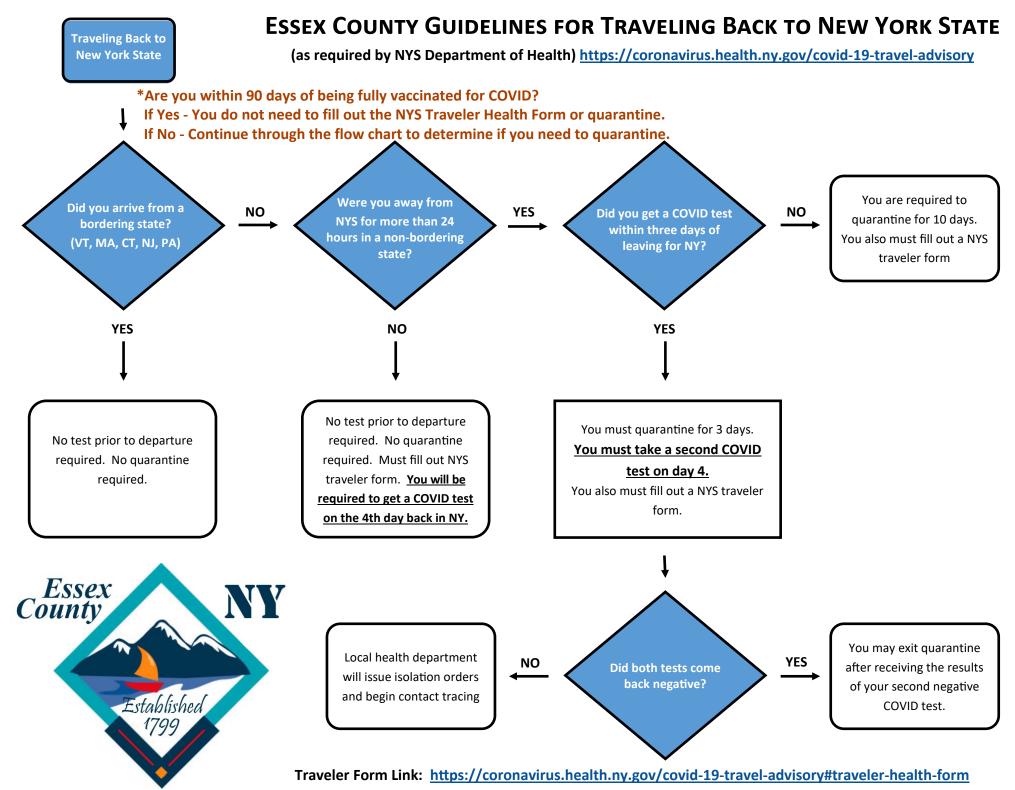
Those who are not fully vaccinated must follow the current NYS Travel Advisory guidelines, which can be reviewed at https://coronavirus.health.ny.gov/covid-19-travel-advisory and are noted here and on the attached flow chart:

For any traveler to New York State from a noncontiguous state, US territory or CDC level 2 and higher country, guidelines for travelers to test-out of the mandatory 10-day quarantine are as follows:

- For travelers who were out-of-state for more than 24 hours:
 - Travelers must obtain a test within three days of departure, prior to arrival in New York.
 - The traveler must, upon arrival in New York, quarantine for three days.
 - On day 4 of their quarantine, the traveler must obtain another COVID test. If both tests comes back negative, the traveler may exit quarantine early upon receipt of the second negative diagnostic test.
- For travelers who were out-of-state for less than 24 hours:
 - The traveler does not need a test prior to their departure from the other state, and does not need to quarantine upon arrival in New York State.
 - However, the traveler must fill out our traveler form upon entry into New York State, and take a COVID diagnostic test 4 days after their arrival in New York.

All travelers who either plan to test-out or who plan to complete the 10-day quarantine <u>must</u> continue to fill out the Traveler Health Form upon arrival into New York State to contribute to New York State's robust contact tracing program.

The travel guidelines require all New Yorkers, as well as those visiting from out-of-state, to take personal responsibility for compliance in the best interest of public health and safety.



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
